Enrollment Policy

The Parks & Recreation Department offers programs to Lincoln Residents. Participants are accepted on a first come, first serve basis, once registration is open. Participants must register and pay in full prior to attending any programs.

Non-Residents

Non-Lincoln Residents will be accepted on a space-available basis. There is an extra **\$35 per week charge**.

Financial Assistance

A limited amount of financial aid is available for Lincoln Residents. The **deadline for submitting a Financial Aid application is April 25 and awards will be made by May 18**. Application forms are in the PRD Office or at www.lincolnrec.com. Residents seeking financial aid or other arrangements must register in person or by mail.

Registration

All registrations must be accompanied by a **\$50 per week non-refundable deposit**. Registrations can be made up to 4:00 pm the Friday before a camp week starts. **Applicants CANNOT register and attend camp on the same day**. Once you have registered, you will receive an email from CampDoc requesting you to complete your camper's paperwork online.

Payment

Please make all checks payable to the Town of Lincoln. Cash, Visa & MasterCard are also accepted.

Confirmations

Due to the number of registrations, we do not confirm placement. If you do not hear from us you should assume you are enrolled.

Waitlist

If the camp week you register for is FULL, you will be notified and placed on a waitlist. If an opening becomes available we will contact you.

Accessibility

The Parks & Recreation Department strives to make programs accessible to all. If participants have any special needs they should contact the Parks & Recreation Director in advance.

Campership Drive

If you are able to support other Lincoln children who cannot afford summer camp the Parks & Recreation Department has a way for you to help. Last year over 10% of our campers received financial assistance. If you'd like to contribute to our Campership Fund, we will see to it that the money helps other Lincolniters attend. Donations of all amounts are greatly appreciated and tax-deductible.

Cancellation Policy

Cancellations must be received in writing at least 10 calendar days before the first day of a camp week. The Parks & Recreation Department reserves the right to cancel programs which do not support themselves.

Refund / Switch Policy

- ◆ The non-refundable \$50/week deposit will be retained per person for all **Camp Week** withdrawals.
- ◆ A \$50 per session fee will be retained per person for all **CIT Program** withdrawals.
- ◆ No refunds will be given within 10 calendar days of the first day of a camp session.
- ◆ We do not issue credit card refunds; we issue check refunds only.
- ◆ Participants not accepted into the program will receive a full refund.
- ◆ Participants may switch weeks more than one week in advance at no charge. Otherwise a \$25 fee will be charged.

Wednesdays will remain our field trip day for Grades K-5. Campers in Grades 6-8 will continue to head out on 3 trips per week.


Thursdays will be Dress-up & Pizza Day.


RAMBLERS CAMP (GRADES 2 - 3)

TRAILBLAZERS CAMP (GRADES 6 - 8)

For campers entering grades 6,7 & 8. This camp will focus on off-campus activities. We will be taking campers on adventures that provide opportunities for personal growth, independence, peer socializing, team building and leadership. Each week will strive to offer a balanced series of programs such as hiking, sailing, rock climbing & camping, as well as field trips. Some of our past field trips include Discovery Adventures, Mt. Monadnock, Canobie Lake Park, Water Country, Six Flags & Jiminy Peak! While on campus, campers will be offered programming such as archery, sports, STEM, hiking, team building projects & more!

The basic camp day is 9 am to 3 pm.

Each week is unique, so the schedule will be communicated on a weekly basis. Certain field trips may return late to campus due to their distance (i.e. Six Flags New England & Water Country). *Due to the frequent travel schedule for this camp, American Red Cross Swim lessons are NOT offered.* Campers should bring snack and lunch.



COUNSELOR-IN-TRAINING (GRADES 9 - 11)

The Lincoln Summer Camp is offering a Counselor-In-Training program for three 2 week sessions for teens entering grades 9, 10 and 11. The program is designed to help CITs develop their leadership skills, acquire and demonstrate skills in working with children, work together in a cooperative group setting, and have fun! The CIT Program is based on the following philosophies:

- Positive reinforcement is key in helping participants feel like valued members of the group. It not only enhances the self esteem of the individual member but will also help the group achieve a level of autonomy and self respect.
- The CIT will become aware of the guidelines & structure of the daily operation of camp, thereby developing a sense of responsibility toward the camp and its members.
- Being able to contribute a part of the whole toward someone else's well being can be an important source of self esteem.
