Lincoln Cemetery Commission Minutes of the meeting held on June 6, 2023

The Lincoln Cemetery Commission held its monthly meeting on Tuesday, June 6, 2023, at Town Offices. Present: Doug Harding, Chair, Manley Boyce, Commissioner, Rob Todd, Commissioner, Valerie Fox, Cemetery Agent and Nathalie Rice, Cemetery Agent Assistant.

The meeting opened at 10:03 AM.

1. The Cemetery Commission approved the minutes of the meeting of May 2, 2023.
2. The Commission was notified of the following interments:
 - a. Koehler, Edward – Full Burial

4. The Commissioners discussed how to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the Dalin Statue. Members also discussed repatination of the statue which was suggested by the statue's

conservator after her work this spring. Mr. Todd will research companies that can perform this important work.

5. The Commission noted the receipt of a letter dated May 22, 2023 from Mr. Joerg Knaf, grandson of Wolfgang and Elisabeth Gruneberg who are buried in the Lincoln Cemetery. Mr. Knaf requested that the Commission seek his and his brother's permission for any future interments. The Commission discussed the fact that the lot was purchased by Mr. Knaf's mother, and that she would therefore have authority over permission for any future interments.
6. The Commissioners agreed to refund \$1,000 to the daughter of Mr. Dewey Greenfield for Lot #1005.
7. The Commission approved a request for an upright marker and a flat marker for Bernard Blood, Lot #1055.
8. The Commission approved a request for a flat marker for Katherine Row, Lot #973.
9. The Commission discussed the guidelines for markers, making it clear that all markers could be accompanied by a Veteran's marker.
 - a. Juniper Way, 4' x 5' Lots - one standard flat marker or one larger size flat marker.
 - b. Juniper Way 4' x 10' Lots – two standard flat markers, or one larger flat marker.
 - c. Fern Way upright monument guidelines based on the sale of two lots.
 - i. Straight – 29" height including a 3" base.
 - ii. Slanted – 24" height including a 6" base.
 - d. Regular Lots – in permitted locations
 - i. Upright – 42" including monument and base. Base and length of the monument cannot exceed 54".
 - ii. Cremation – 1 flat marker per cremation.
10. Ms. Fox presented the status of year-end financial accounts.
11. The Commission approved the installation of a bench on James Cunningham lot, #1032A.
12. The Commission approved the installation of a bench on behalf of the Liazos/Buendia family.
13. Unanticipated business was addressed:
 - a. Ms. Fox reported that she has contacted Tamara Conde for an estimate for repair and resetting of head stones in the cemetery.
 - b. Ms. Fox read letters of thanks from Nancy Henderson and Jennifer Glover.
 - c. Ms. Fox updated the Commission on a request from Mr. Donald Hafner, regarding lots owned by the Tyler/Harris family. He wished to memorialize the lots of five children deceased in 1917 whose graves remain unmarked.

The meeting adjourned at 11:30 am.
