

ABOUT THIS PROPERTY

Welcome to Mount Misery conservation land where 5 miles of trails wind through 227 acres of agricultural fields, woods, hills, and ponds. Acquired in 1969 with financial support from the Federal Land & Water Conservation Fund and MA Self Help grant program, preservation of this property created an ecological corridor linking Walden Pond, Mass Audubon, Adams Woods, and Great Meadows National Wildlife Refuge.

Mt. Misery sits on the original homeland of the Massachusetts Tribal Nation. Today, the wide wood roads and trails make the area inviting to birdwatchers, dog walkers, skiers, and horseback riders. The Canoe Landing on Route 117 provides access to the Sudbury River for small boats and kayaks.

The Bay Circuit Trail (BCT) winds its way through Mt. Misery. Learn more about the BCT at <https://www.baycircuit.org>.

DOG WALKING AT MT. MISERY

Due to the amount of dogs visiting Mt. Misery, Lincoln adopted the following **Dog Regulations** in order to protect the sensitive water resources, wildlife, and other visitors' enjoyment:

- **Dogs must be leashed** in the parking lots, around the agricultural fields and on all designated trails. See map on opposite side and look for "Leash Area" trail markers.
- On other trails, dogs must be leashed or under **effective voice control** at all times. Dogs must remain on trails.
- **Pick up and properly dispose of your dog's waste**, every time.
