

ABOUT THIS PROPERTY

One of the most prominent features of Lincoln's landscape, Flint's Pond, serves as the town's primary drinking water supply. Over 200 acres of conservation land surround the pond. To protect the public water supply, all dogs must be leashed and all visitors must remain on marked trails. No activities of any kind are permitted on or in Flint's Pond.

Flint's Pond and the land surrounding it sits on the original homeland of the Massachusetts Tribal Nation. Today, the wide wood roads and trails make the area inviting to birdwatchers, skiers, and walkers with dogs on leash. Some of the trails are open to trail biking (blue trails on map) and horseback riders. Trails connect to deCordova Sculpture Park, Pine Hill Conservation Land, and the Lincoln elementary schools (across Sandy Pond Rd). Some trails cross private property.

TRAIL RULES

We hope that you enjoy exploring this property. Please be respectful toward other visitors, wildlife, and the land during your visit. Some activities require a **group use permit**. Scan the QR Code for complete Trail Rules.



FLINT'S POND CONSERVATION AREA REGULATIONS

To protect the public water supply, Lincoln adopted the following **special rules**:

- No activities of any kind are permitted on or in Flint's Pond, or on the adjacent shoreline. **No fishing, boating, swimming, or skating on Flint's Pond.**
- All visitors and their pets must **remain on the marked trails.**
- **Dogs must always be leashed at Flint's Pond Conservation Area** (you may walk your dog off-leash, if under voice control, at the nearby Pine Hill).
- **Pick up and properly dispose of your dog's waste**, every time.
